Graduation Requirements...



Students are responsible to ensure they meet all graduation requirements:

- Completion of 230 credits
- **160 credits** should be *completed* by the start of senior year

- AP/honor courses require a signed contract



Prerequisites, Auditions, Interviews...

- Prerequisites: previous course completed, minimum grade requirement
- Audition required for: Madrigals, Advanced
 Treble Choir, Jazz Choir, Jazz Band, Baroque
 Ensemble, Symphony Orchestra, Symphonic Band
- Application/Interviews required for: AVID, Student Government, Link Crew, HUB

Appeal Process...

- 1. Prerequisite Appeal Form
- 2. Student Self-Reflection
- 3. Parent Observation
- 4. Teacher Observation Form

Due when you return course selection form

(Teachers will send their own forms.)



A-G subject requirements...

 UC/CSU minimum eligibility requirements for freshman admission



- UC/CSU A-G subject requirements are:
 - A History/Social Science 2 years
 - B English 4 years
 - C Mathematics 3 years (UC requires minimum IM3)
 - D Laboratory Science 2 years/3 years rec
 - E Language Other Than English (LOTE) 2 years/3 years rec
 - F Visual/Performing Arts 1 year
 - G College Prep Electives 1 year





You must sign up for one of the following yearlong sequences:

- 1. US Gov P/Economics P
- 2. US Gov AP/Economics P
- 3. US Gov AP/Micro or Macro AP

**Pay close attention to course and grade prerequisite requirements!!

English (b)...



*4 years required for UC/CSU & H.S. graduation

Select one:

- 1. British Literature P
- 2. Senior Literature P
- 3. Science Fiction P
- 4. English Literature & Composition AP
 - * In the fall, *all seniors* will write the Personal Insight Questions for UC admission in their English class.

Mathematics (c)...

3 years required for UC/CSU

(UC requires minimum IM3)



Two years required for H.S. graduation-

One year must be an Algebra course or Integrated Mathematics 1

- Read appropriate course descriptions and "prerequisites"
- Discuss best course with your math teacher

Laboratory Science (d)...

- One year each of physical science and life science required to graduate
- View chart in course catalog
- Check prerequisites for science courses
- UC and CSU require minimum -- two years of lab science
- 3 years recommended

Language Other Than English (e)...

WORLD LANGUAGE (LOTE)



Not required for high school graduation

• UC/CSU require 2 years of the same language

• 3 years of same language recommended

Visual and Performing Arts (f)... VAPA



- One year required for UC/CSU
- Music, Art, Drama, The Art & History of Floral Design
- Not required for high school graduation

Note: Please provide <u>alternate courses</u>

Electives (g)...



Graduation requirement:

- 15 semesters of elective courses
- "Electives": credits that exceed minimum subject requirements needed for high school graduation

College requirement:

1 year (2 semesters) of college preparatory elective

Additional grad requirements...

- Health (1 semester)
- Geography/Social Science (1 semester)
- Physical Education (2 years)
- CTE/Practical Art (1 semester)

Note: Students in a yearlong CTE/practical arts course must complete the entire year

CTE Pathways

- Seven CTE Pathways for students
- Represent a variety of industry sectors and career interests
 - *Ag and Natural Sciences
 - *Engineering and Architecture
 - *Health Science and Medical Technology
 - *Transportation
 - *Arts, Media, and Entertainment
 - *Information and Communication Technologies (ICT)
 - *Software and Systems Development (DVCA)

Internship



Internship Course

- Students matched to unpaid internship opportunities based upon career interests and abilities, if available
- Class scheduled as one of student's seven courses
- Student earns 2.5 credits for course

DSHS Athletics...



- Fall sport sign up for <u>DSHS Athletics Fall</u>
- Winter sport—sign up for <u>DSHS Athletics Winter</u>
- Spring sport sign up for <u>DSHS Athletics Spring</u>
- IF Possible a free 7th will be scheduled for DSHS Athletics

AP/Honor contract...



Must be signed by student and parent

Attach to course planner

 Counselors <u>do not recommend</u> more than 3 AP/Honor courses for seniors

Academic Support classes...



- AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination)
- **ELD** (English Language Development)
- Contact Mrs. McInturf for application

Academic Center is open to all students.

Add/Drop Deadline...



- May only add/drop a course if available through the end of the second week of school by noon.
- Spring semester: Yearlong courses will only be dropped for extenuating circumstances with administrative approval

Plan for your future!

- Counselors are available to meet with you to prepare for future interests (post-secondary)
- Naviance enables you to:
 - Explore career interests and colleges
 - Manage your own exploration of post-secondary options
 - Learn about scholarships
 - Locate Letter of Recommendation packet (Also on Blue Devil Portal)

Athletes...

Potential NCAA Student Athletes:



- 2.3 GPA required to be eligible for Division I
- 16 core courses required (p.11)
- Register by end of 11th grade with NCAA or NAIA
 Reminders for DSHS athletes:
- Sports Physical packet completed yearly

Grade Remediation...

- Only "C" grades in college prep ("P") classes count toward a-g eligibility!!!
- Most D and F grades should be repeated for 4 year college eligibility
- Work with your counselor regarding options for remediation

Courses can be taken for:



Remediation


Deficiency (if cannot be made up during school year)

Notify DSHS Counseling office to adjust your schedule if your <u>summer school plans change</u>

Non DJUSD courses...

- Board policy allows us to post up to 10 credits on our transcript for courses from other accredited institutions
- 10 credits = one semester college course or two semesters of high school level courses
- See page 51 for details
- Note: Students may take non-DJUSD courses for "enrichment"

- Step #1: Plan your courses
 - Seniors must take a minimum of 5 classes



 Take time to plan your classes. Think of your selections as FINAL choices.



- Step #1: Planning reminders!!
 - Include ALTERNATES for VAPA and CTE/Practical Art classes
 - Do not select courses if you do not meet the prerequisites
 - Sign up for audition/interview classes if you have been selected
 - If you have not received results for these classes, sign up for the class you would want as an alternate



- Step #2: Sign up for courses online
 - Login to Q Student Connect atNEW: https://studentportal.djusd.net
 - Portal open: January 30-February 27
 - Use your identification # (School ID) and password
 - Passwords and ID are case sensitive
 - Select next year's grade level from dropdown menu
 - Enter course selections





• Step #3: Submit your Course Request Planner

 Bring your course planner and optional forms (AP Contract/summer school form/appeal form)

Due February 28-March 1
