GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 230 credits for a high school diploma
- 9th grade *Is first year of high school*. Credits earned apply toward 230 credits
- Courses not required for high school graduation count as "elective" credits

A-G SUBJECT REQUIREMENTS

- UC/CSU minimum eligibility requirements for freshman admission
- UC/CSU a-g subject requirements are:
 - a History/Social Science 2 years
 - b English 4 years
 - c Mathematics 3 years
 - d Laboratory Science 2 years /3 years rec
 - e Language Other Than English (LOTE) 2 years /3 years rec
 - f Visual/Performing Arts 1 year
 - g College Prep Electives 1 year

B. ENGLISH

Identity and Ethnic Literature P



- English 10 Honors P* (weighted grade)
 - * More reading and writing than English 10 P (read prerequisites in course catalog)

C. MATHEMATICS

High School Diploma: minimum level= 1M1
UC/CSU: minimum level=IM3

- See math chart in course catalog
- Read appropriate course descriptions and "prerequisites"
- Discuss best course with your math teacher

D. SCIENCE

High School Diploma: 1 year physical and 1 year life science UC/CSU: 1 year physical and 1 year of LAB science (see pg. 16)

- View chart in course catalog.
- Check prerequisites for science courses

E. LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

WORLD LANGUAGE (LOTE)

Not required for high school graduation

Colleges require 2 years of the <u>same language</u>
 At least one year must be completed in grades 9-12

3 years of same language recommended for college

F. VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS (VAPA)

- Not required for high school graduation
- One year required for UC/CSU
- Music, Art, Drama, The Art and History of Floral Design, and Intermediate/Advanced Dance

Note: Please provide <u>alternate courses</u>

G. ELECTIVES

Graduation requirement:

- 15 semesters of elective courses
- "electives" -- are courses beyond minimum subject graduation requirements

• College requirement:

1 year (2 semesters) of college preparatory elective

ADDITIONAL HS GRAD REQUIREMENTS

- Health (1 semester)
- Geography/Social Science (1 semester)
- Physical Education (2 years)
- CTE/Practical Art (1 semester)

 Note: Students in a yearlong CTE/practical arts course must complete the entire year

CTE / PRACTICAL ARTS

- Career Technical Education classes
- Practical Art classes

- <u>CTE</u>: Everything from Multimedia Journalism to Ag Engineering to Robotics
- <u>Practical Art</u>: Library Assistant, Office Assistant, Peer Tutor, Student Government, Yearbook
- Demonstrate to employers and colleges your interest and skills in real-world career fields – see page 22

CTE PATHWAYS

- Seven CTE Pathways for students next year

Advanced Placement (AP)

- Advanced Placement (AP)
 AP classes are challenging and take more time
- AP/honor courses contract --
 - *Must be signed by student and parent
- AP exams: given each May at DSHS
 - *can earn college credit if score 3, 4, or 5
- Counselors <u>do not recommend</u> more than 2
 AP/Honor courses for sophomores



APPEAL PROCESS



- 1. Prerequisite Appeal Form
- 2. Student Self-Reflection
- 3. Parent Observation
- 4. Teacher Observation Form

<u>Due when you return course selection form</u>

(Teachers will send their own forms.)

Add/Drop Deadline



- May only add/drop a course if available through the second Friday of the school year.
- Spring semester: Yearlong courses will only be dropped for extenuating circumstances with administrative approval

Plan for your future!



 Meet with counselors during all three years at DSHS to prepare for future interests (post-secondary)





- 2.3 GPA required to be eligible for Division I
- 16 core courses required for both Division I and Division II
- Page 11 further details

Reminders for athletes:

- Sports Physical packet must be completed yearly
- It is recommended that athletes sign up for a free per 7

(if you sign up for DHS Athletics you will be given a free 7th period unless there is a scheduling conflict)

Grade Remediation

- Only "C" grades in college prep ("P") classes count for 4 year college admission!!!
- Most D and F grades should be repeated for 4 year college eligibility (English 9 offered at summer school)
- Grades 10 and 11 are most important for UC/CSU admission

Courses can be taken for:

Remediation

Deficiency (if cannot be made up during school year)

Notify DSHS Counseling office to adjust your schedule if your <u>summer school plans change</u>

Non-DJUSD Course Policy



- Board policy allows us to post up to 10 credits on our transcripts for courses from other accredited institutions.
- 10 credits = one semester college course or two semesters of high school level courses.
- Go to page 51 for details

- Step #1: Plan your courses
 - Sophomores must take a minimum of 6 classes
 - You may request a free period 1 or 7 (no guarantee)
 Note: Athletes not taking DSHS Athletics should sign up for a <u>free period 7</u>
 - Take time to plan your classes. Think of your selections as FINAL choices.



- Step #1: Planning reminders!!
 - Include ALTERNATES for VAPA and CTE/Practical Art classes
 - Do not select courses if you do not meet the prerequisites
 - Sign up for audition/interview classes if you have been selected
 - If you have not received notification, sign up for the class you would want as an alternate



• Step #2: Obtain signatures

- Step #3: Sign up for courses online
 - Login to Q Student Connect at NEW: https://studentportal.djusd.net/
 - Portal open: January 30 February 27
 - Use your identification # (School ID) and password
 - Passwords and ID are case sensitive
 - Select next year's grade level from dropdown menu
 - Enter course selections
 - Guard your pin and password carefully

- Step #4: Submit your Course Request Planner
 - Make sure you have the necessary signatures
 - Paperwork is due on the following dates:
