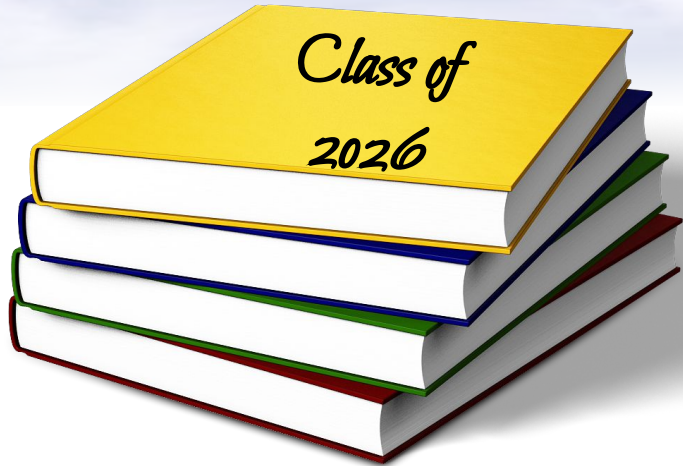
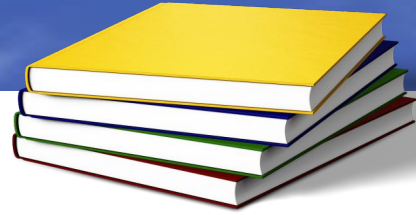

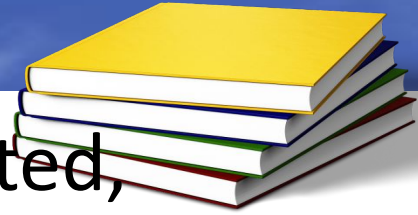


# DSHS homework policy...

# *Prerequisites, Auditions, Interviews...*



- ***Prerequisites:*** previous course completed, minimum grade requirement
- ***Audition required for:*** Madrigals, Advanced Treble Choir, Jazz Choir, Jazz Band, Baroque Ensemble, Symphony Orchestra, Symphonic Band
- ***Application/Interview required for:*** AVID, Student Government, Link Crew, HUB

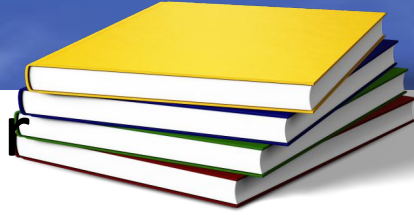


1. Prerequisite Appeal Form

# A-G Subject Requirements...



- UC/CSU minimum eligibility requirements for freshman admission
- UC/CSU a-g subject requirements are:
  - a – History/Social Science – 2 years
  - b – English – 4 years
  - c – Mathematics – 3 years
  - d – Laboratory Science – 2 years/3 years rec
  - e – Language other Than English (LOTE) – 2 years/3 years rec
  - f – Visual/Performing Arts – 1 year
  - g – College Prep Electives – 1 year

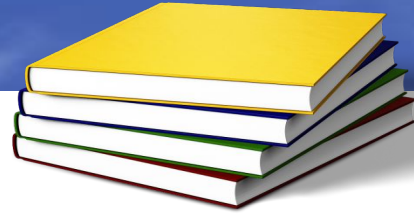
# History (a)...



1. U.S. History P
2. Race and Social Justice in US History P (RSJ)
3. U.S. History AP (APUSH)
  - Note summer assignment may be required



# English (b)...

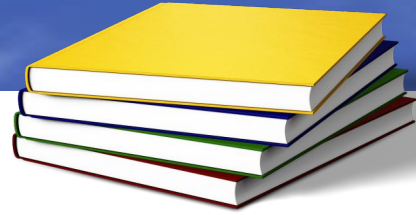


4 years required for UC/CSU & H.S. graduation

Select one:

1. American Voices P
2. American Literature Honors P
  - “A” in Identity and Ethnic Literature **or** “A” or “B” in English 10 honors

# Mathematics (c)...



- 3 years required for UC/CSU

(UC/CSU requires minimum IM3)

- **Two years required for H.S. graduation**

one year must be an Algebra course or Integrated Mathematics 1

- View chart in course catalog
- Read appropriate course descriptions and “prerequisites”
- Discuss best course with your math teacher

# Laboratory Science (d)...



- One year each of physical science and life science required to graduate
- View chart in course catalog
- Check prerequisites for science courses
- UC and CSU require minimum of *two years of lab science*: page 16 comparison chart
- 3 years recommended

# Language Other Than English (e)...

## **WORLD LANGUAGE (LOTE):**



- Not required for high school graduation
- CSU/UC's require 2 years of the same language
- 3 years of same language recommended

# Visual and Performing Arts (V) ... VAPA

- **One year required for UC/CSU**
- Not required for **High School graduation**
- Music, Art, Drama, The Art & History of Floral Design



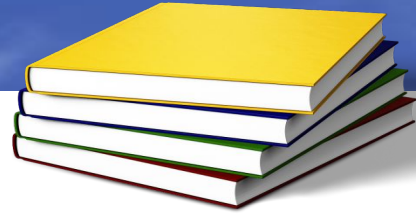

# *Electives (g)...*



- **Graduation requirement:**
  - 15 semesters of elective courses
  - “electives”: credits that exceed minimum subject requirements needed for high school graduation
- **College requirement:**
  - 1 year (2 semesters) of college preparatory elective

# *Additional grad requirements...*



- Health (1 semester)
- Geography/Social Science (1 semester)
- Physical Education (2 years)
- CTE/Practical Art (1 semester)

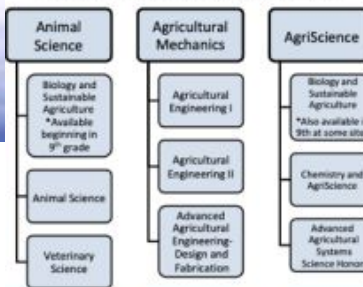
*Note: Students in a yearlong practical arts course must complete the entire year.*

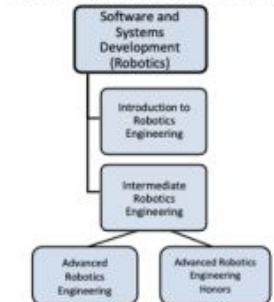
## Industry Sector: Ag and Natural Sciences

Courses available beginning in 10<sup>th</sup> grade unless noted



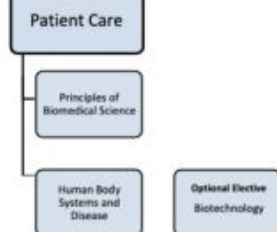
## Industry Sector: Information & Communications Technology (ICT)

Courses available beginning in 10<sup>th</sup> grade unless noted



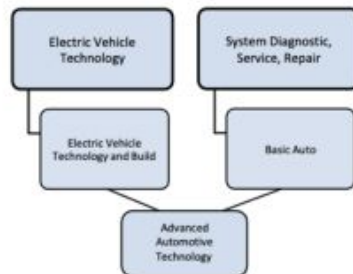
## Industry Sector: Health Sciences and Medical Technology

Courses available beginning in 10<sup>th</sup> grade unless noted



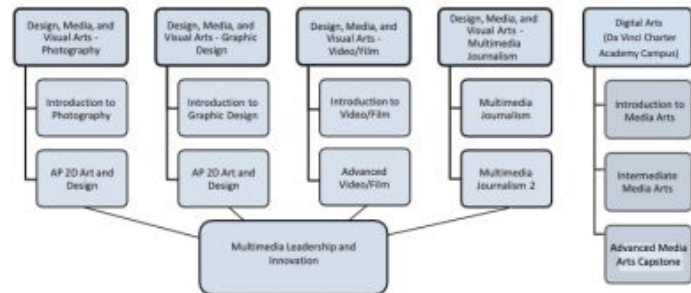
## Industry Sector: Transportation

Honors Elective Option for 2<sup>nd</sup> Year

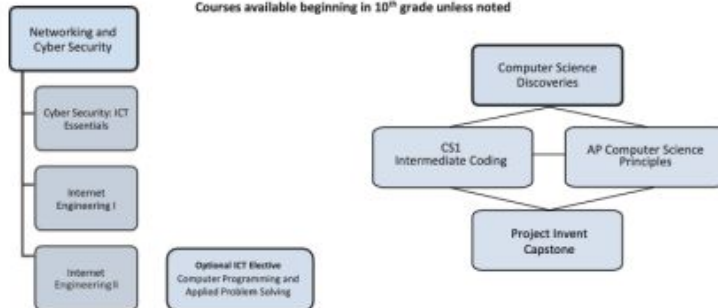

# Internship



## Internship Course

- Students matched to unpaid internship opportunities based upon career interests and abilities, if available
- Class scheduled as one of student's seven courses
- Student earns 2.5 credits for course
- See internship coordinator for more information

# Add/Drop Deadline...



- May only add/drop a course ***if available*** through the 2nd Friday of the school year
- ***Spring semester***: Yearlong courses will **only** be dropped for extenuating circumstances with administrative approval

## Grade Remediation...



- **Only “C” grades** in college prep (“P”) classes count for 4 year college admission!!!
- Most D and F grades should be repeated for 4 year college eligibility
- Work with your counselor regarding options for remediation

# Summer School...



- Courses can be taken for:

Remediation

Deficiency (if cannot be made up during school year)

*Notify DSHS Counseling office to adjust your schedule if your summer school plans change*

# *Academic Support Services...*



- **Math Lab:**
  - Offered during period 7
- **Academic Center**
  - Hours: M-Thurs 8am-4:30pm and Fri 8am-3:30pm
- **Math and Science Tutors (MAST)**
  - Available during lunch

## Non DJUSD courses...



- Board policy allows us to post up to 10 credits on our transcripts for courses from other accredited institutions
- 10 credits = one semester college course or two semesters of high school level courses
- *Go to page 51 for details*
- *Note: Students may take non-DJUSD courses for “enrichment”*



# Dual Enrollment



## WHAT IS HISPANIC SERVING INSTITUTION EARLY COLLEGE PROGRAM (HSI-ECP)?



HSI-ECP is a Dual Enrollment program with Sacramento City College that allows eligible high school students:

- To enroll in community college classes
- Earn college and high school credits at the same time
- Be exempt from tuition & enrollment fees (FREE COLLEGE!)
- Have access to Free TEXTBOOKS

### SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Designated College Counselor
- Student Support Specialists
- College Success Workshops
- Closed courses with Sac City College
- Tutoring
- Access to Sac City student services
- Family, Mentorship, & Community Building

### ELIGIBILITY:

#### Students must:

- Be at least 14yo
- Have a minimum GPA of 2.0

#### And meet one or more of the following:

- Self-identify as LatinX or other historically under-resourced community
- Qualify for free or reduced-priced lunch
- Attend a participating high school

# Scheduling Process...

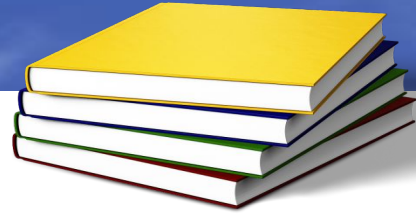


- **Step #1: Plan your courses**

- Juniors must take a minimum of 5 classes
- You may request a free period(s) 1 and/or 7 or 6 and 7 (no guarantee that this will be granted)
- ***Take time to plan your classes.*** Think of your selections as **FINAL** choices.

# *Scheduling Process...*

- **Step #2: Obtain signatures**



- Sign your course request planner
- Parents sign the completed course planner

# Scheduling Process...



- **Step #3: Sign up for courses online**

- Login to Q Student Connect at
- **NEW:** <https://studentportal.djUSD.net/>
- Portal open: **January 29 – February 26**
- Use your identification # (School ID) and password
- Passwords and ID are case sensitive
- Select next year's grade level from dropdown menu
- Enter course selections
