

# **College and Career**

4-year high school plan will help you prioritize, set goals, and manage your time appropriately.

A plan is a road map to the direction you're headed. Your plan should involve a list of objectives, your course work, and your extracurricular activities.

The plan will show you what milestones you've covered and if any changes should be made along the way.

### AUDITIONS/INTERVIEWS REQUIRED

- Prerequisites: previous course completed, minimum grade requirement
- Audition required for: Madrigals, Advanced
   Treble Choir, Jazz Choir, Jazz Band, Baroque
   Ensemble, Symphony Orchestra, Symphonic Band
- Applications/Interviews required for: Student Government, AVID, HUB, Link Crew

### APPEAL PROCESS



- 1. Prerequisite Appeal Form
- 2. Student Self-Reflection
- 3. Parent Observation
- 4. Teacher Observation Form

### <u>Due when you return course selection form</u>

(Teachers will send their own forms.)

# GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 230 credits for a high school diploma
- 9<sup>th</sup> grade *Is first year of high school*. Credits earned apply toward 230 credits
- Courses not required for high school graduation count as "elective" credits

# A-G SUBJECT REQUIREMENTS

- UC/CSU minimum eligibility requirements for freshman admission
- UC/CSU a-g subject requirements are:
  - a History/Social Science 2 years
  - b English 4 years
  - c Mathematics 3 years
  - d Laboratory Science 2 years /3 years rec
  - e Language Other Than English (LOTE) 2 years /3 years rec
  - f Visual/Performing Arts 1 year
  - g College Prep Electives 1 year

# B. ENGLISH

Identity and Ethnic Literature P



- English 10 Honors P\* (weighted grade)
  - \* More reading and writing than English 10 P (read prerequisites in course catalog)

# C. MATHEMATICS

High School Diploma: minimum level= 1M1
UC/CSU: minimum level=IM3

- See math chart in course catalog
- Read appropriate course descriptions and "prerequisites"
- Discuss best course with your math teacher

# D. SCIENCE

High School Diploma: 1 year physical and 1 year life science UC/CSU: 1 year physical and 1 year of LAB science ( see pg. 16)

- View chart in course catalog.
- Check prerequisites for science courses

### E. LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

### WORLD LANGUAGE (LOTE)

Not required for high school graduation

Colleges require 2 years of the <u>same language</u>
 At least one year must be completed in grades 9-12

3 years of same language recommended for college

### F. VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS (VAPA)

- Not required for high school graduation
- One year required for UC/CSU
- Music, Art, Drama, The Art and History of Floral Design, and Intermediate/Advanced Dance

Note: Please provide <u>alternate courses</u>

# G. ELECTIVES

### Graduation requirement:

- 15 semesters of elective courses
- "electives" -- are courses beyond minimum subject graduation requirements

### • College requirement:

1 year (2 semesters) of college preparatory elective

# ADDITIONAL HS GRAD REQUIREMENTS

- Health (1 semester)
- Ethnic Studies (1 semester)
- Physical Education (2 years)
- CTE/Practical Art (1 semester)

 Note: Students in a yearlong CTE/practical arts course must complete the entire year

### AUID

- Helps students prepare for and navigate the college and financial aid application process
- Builds skills to help students in current classes
- College prep "g" elective course
- Fulfills practical art graduation requirement







### DSHS ATHLETICS



- Fall sport sign up for <u>DSHS Athletics Fall</u>
- Winter sport—sign up for <u>DSHS Athletics Winter</u>
- Spring sport sign up for <u>DSHS Athletics Spring</u>
- You will sign up for 6 classes plus DSHS Athletics
- If possible a free per 7 will be scheduled for DSHS Athletics.

### Advanced Placement (AP)

Advanced Placement (AP)
 AP classes are challenging and take more time



- AP exams: given each May at DSHS
  - \*can earn college credit if score 3, 4, or 5
- Counselors <u>do not recommend</u> more than 2
   AP/Honor courses for sophomores

# Add/Drop Deadline



- May only add/drop a course if available through the second Friday of the school year.
- Spring semester: Yearlong courses will only be dropped for extenuating circumstances with administrative approval

# GRADE REMEDIATION

- Only "C" grades in college prep ("P") classes count for 4 year college admission!!!
- Most D and F grades should be repeated for 4 year college eligibility (English 9 offered at summer school)
- Grades 10 and 11 are most important for UC/CSU admission

Courses can be taken for:

**Deficiency** (if cannot be made up during school year)

- Academic Center
  - Hours: M-Thurs 8am-4:30pm and Fri 8am-3:30pm
- Math and Science Tutors (MAST)
  - Available during lunch



## Non-DJUSD Course Policy



- Board policy allows us to post up to 10 credits on our transcripts for courses from other accredited institutions.
- 10 credits = one semester college course or two semesters of high school level courses.

#### WHAT IS HISPANIC SERVING INSTITUTION **EARLY COLLEGE PROGRAM (HSI-ECP)?**



HSI-FCP is a Dual Enrollment program with Sacramento City College that allows eligible high school students:

- To enroll in community college classes
- Earn college and high school credits at the same time
- Be exempt from tuition & enrollment fees (FREE COLLEGE!)
- Have access to Free TEXTBOOKS

#### SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Designated College Counselor
- Student Support Specialists
- College Success Workshops
- Closed courses with Sac City College
- Tutoring
- · Access to Sac City student services
- Family, Mentorship, & Community Building

#### **ELIGIBILITY:**



- Be at least 14yo
- Have a minimum GPA of 2.0

#### And meet one or more of the following:

- · Self-identify as LatinX or other historically under-resourced community
- · Qualify for free or reduced-priced lunch
- · Attend a participating high school

- Step #1: Plan your courses
  - Sophomores must take a minimum of 6 classes
  - You may request a free period 1 or 7 (no guarantee)
     Note: Athletes taking DSHS Athletics should sign up for a <u>free period 7</u>
  - Take time to plan your classes. Think of your selections as FINAL choices.

- Step #3: Sign up for courses online
  - Login to Q Student Connect at
     NEW: <a href="https://studentportal.djusd.net/">https://studentportal.djusd.net/</a>
  - Portal open: January 29 February 26
  - Use your identification # (School ID) and password
  - Passwords and ID are case sensitive
  - Select next year's grade level from dropdown menu
  - Enter course selections
  - Guard your pin and password carefully

- Step #4: Submit your Course Request Planner
  - Make sure you have the necessary signatures
  - Paperwork is due on the following dates:
