DEADLINE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR SENIORS GRADUATING FROM A HIGH SCHOOL IN DAVIS

MEW! Mar. 15 ROY AND CYNTHIA KROENER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: Graduating senior from a high school in Davis who has demonstrated financial need, minimum GPA of 3.0, and is planning to attend a two- or four-year college or university. **Award**: \$3,000 - \$5,000.

Apply: Sac Reg Community Foundation.

DEADLINE REGIONAL AND NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Jan. 4 GE-REAGAN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Eligibility: High school seniors who exhibit the attributes of leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship. Academic performance, financial need and extracurricular activities will be considered. **Award**: \$10,000 renewable for four years. **Apply:** GE Reagan Foundation Scholarship

Jan. 5 **DILLER TEEN TIKKUN OLAM AWARD**

Eligibility: Jewish teens between 13-19 years old who have volunteered without compensation, demonstrated leadership and are actively involved in projects which embody the spirit of *Tikkun Olam* (repairing the world). **Award:** \$36,000. **Apply:** www.dillerteenawards.org.

Jan. 15 P.E.O. CALIFORNIA STATE CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIPS

Eligibility: High school female seniors can apply for various scholarships offered by the California P.E.O. State Chapter. Students must be California residents studying full time at an accredited U.S. college or university. **Award**: \$2,500. **Apply:** www.peocalifornia.org.

Jan. 31 GOLDEN 1 CREDIT UNION SCHOLARSHIPS

Eligibility: High school seniors planning to attend a two- or four-year college in California. The student or their parent/guardian must be a Golden 1 member for at least one year, have a minimum 3.0 GPA and be involved in volunteer and extracurricular activities. **Award**: \$1,000 - \$5,000. **Apply:** Golden 1 Scholarship.

Jan. 31 **EQUALITY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

Eligibility: High school seniors who have demonstrated service to the LGBT+ community, and are planning to attend a college, university or vocational/trade school in the fall. Students of all sexual orientations and gender identities are eligible to apply. **Award**: \$6,000. **Apply**: www.equalityscholarship.org.

Feb. 1 SCHWAB-ROSENHOUSE SCHOLARSHIPS

Eligibility: High school seniors planning to enroll at a two- or four- year college located within 100 miles of the Sacramento County Courthouse. Applicants will be evaluated on academic record, school, community, and volunteer activities, future education and career plans, and financial need. **Award**: \$1,000 - \$5,000 **Apply**: Schwab Rosenhouse Scholarships

DEADLINE REGIONAL AND NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Feb. 20 TRAVIS CREDIT COMMUNITY IMPACT SCHOLARSHIP

> **Eligibility**: High school seniors who are members of Travis Credit Union. Applicants will be judged on a personal essay, GPA, honors, awards, employment, community service, leadership, extracurricular activities and financial need. Award: \$2,000. Apply: www.traviscu.org/scholarships.

Feb. 29 NORTH WIND QUILTERS GUILD SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

> Eligibility: High school seniors who plan to pursue a degree or vocational certificate at a two- or four-year college in studio arts, graphic arts, design art, illustration, fashion design, interior design, photography, film, or architecture. Award: \$500. Apply: www.northwindquiltersguild.com.

Mar. 1 CABRILLO CIVIC CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

> Eligibility: High school seniors of Portuguese descent, who have a minimum 3.5 GPA, are planning to enroll in a community college or university, and have participated in at least three extra-curricular activities in high school. **Award**: \$500. **Apply:** Cabrillo Club Scholarship.

CALIFORNIA WINE GRAPE GROWERS FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS Mar. 1

> **Eligibility**: High school seniors whose parent(s) or guardian are employees of a California wine grape grower during the current or past wine grape growing season. Selection is based on financial need, scholastic ability, community involvement, leadership and/or work history. Award: \$2,000 -\$8,000. Apply: CAWG Application.

TRI COUNTIES BANK SCHOLARSHIPS Mar. 13

> **Eligibility**: High school students who demonstrate an interest in public service, community engagement and business entrepreneurship. Income-based scholarships and merit-based scholarships are offered.

> **Eligibility**: High school female seniors who plan to pursue a business related degree at a two- or four-year college or university. Students must have a minimum 2.5 GPA and demonstrate financial need. Award: \$1,000 - \$5,000. Apply: Sac Reg Community Foundation.

DEADLINE REGIONAL AND NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Mar. 15 <u>EUGENE AND THORA CHIN SCHOLARSHIP</u>

Eligibility: High school seniors of Asian/Pacific Islander heritage who plan to attend a two- or four-year college or university and have a minimum GPA of 4.0. Preference will be given to students with high financial need and/or high academic merit. Award: \$1,000 - \$6,000. Apply: Sac Reg Community Foundation.

MEW! Mar. 15 STOLBA/SUKKARY FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school senior who plans to attend a two-year college, vocational or trade school in the fall. Student must have a minimum 2.5 GPA and demonstrated financial need. Preference will be given to first generation college students. **Award**: \$1,000 - \$3,000. **Apply**: Sac Reg Community Foundation

MEW! Mar. 15 DIANE DAWSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school seniors who have a parent or legal guardian with terminal cancer or other terminal illness, or lost a parent to a terminal disease during their tenure in high school. Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.5. **Award**: \$1,000 - \$3,000. **Apply**: Sac Reg Community Foundation.

MEW! Mar. 15 GRAYDON AND MYRTH FOX SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school seniors who are the dependent child or grandchild of a U.S. veteran. Preference will be given to dependents of a veteran killed or wounded while on active duty. Students must be pursuing a degree at college, university or trade school and have demonstrated financial need. **Award:** \$1,000 - \$5,000. **Apply:** Sac Reg Community Foundation.

MEW! Mar. 15 KRISTI KARACOZOFF MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school seniors who have a chronic or life-threatening illness. Student must have a minimum GPA of 3.0. **Award**: \$500 - \$1,500. **Apply**: Sac Reg Community Foundation.

MEW! Mar. 15 MARK MCCOLLUM "RIDE ON" SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school seniors who have a minimum GPA of 2.5 and plan to pursue an engineering or construction degree at Sacramento State University. **Award:** \$1,000 to \$2,000. **Apply:** Sac Reg Community Foundation.

MEW! Mar. 15 MAX AND NADINE DIMICK SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school seniors planning to attend a community college in the Sacramento Region (Sacramento, El Dorado, Yolo, Placer) in the fall. Students must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and demonstrate financial need.

Award: Various amounts. Apply: Sac Reg Community Foundation.

NADINE DIMICK NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school seniors who are enrolled in the nursing program at a two- or four-year college or university in the Sacramento region (Sacramento, Placer, El Dorado, Yolo). Student must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and demonstrate financial need. **Award**: \$1,000. **Apply:** Sac Reg Community Foundation.

Eligibility: Graduating seniors who have a minimum GPA of 3.0, demonstrated financial need, and plan to pursue a degree in Public Affairs/Administration or Political Science & Government. **Award**: \$1,000 - \$5,000. **Apply:** Sac Reg Community Foundation.

MEW! Mar. 15 YOLO YOUTH SERVICE AWARDS

Eligibility: High school seniors who have volunteered at least 60 hours with a Yolo County nonprofit organization during their junior and/or senior year(s) of high school. Students must demonstrate leadership, commitment to public service, maturity, and reliability. **Award:** \$1,000.

Apply: Sac Reg Community Foundation

MEW! Mar. 15 MARY ELLEN DOLCINI SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school seniors of Mexican-American descent from Davis Senior High School, King High, Woodland or Pioneer High School. Student must have a minimum 2.5 GPA, demonstrated financial need, and plans to attend a two- or four-year college or vocational/trade school. **Award**: \$2,500 - \$10,000. **Apply:** Sac Reg Community Foundation

MEW! Mar. 15 SAYLOR FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility: High school seniors graduating from a high school in Davis who have a minimum 2.5 GPA and plan to attend a two- or four-year college or vocational/trade school. Student must have experienced significant life challenges, including foster care, death of a family member or other family trauma, teen parenthood, behavioral health challenges, involvement in juvenile justice system, financial need requiring working during high school, etc. Financial need is required. Award: \$1,000 - \$2,500. Apply: Sac Reg Community Foundation.

Apr. 1 ITALIAN CATHOLIC FEDERATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Eligibility: Graduating seniors who are Roman Catholic and of Italian descent, or have a Roman Catholic parent, guardian or grandparent who is a member of the Italian Catholic Federation. Students will be evaluated on achievement, financial need, and extracurricular activities. **Award**: Various Amounts. **Apply**: Italian Catholic Federation Scholarships.

TOP TEN SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION TIPS

1. GIVE CONCRETE EXAMPLES WHEN ANSWERING AN ESSAY QUESTION

If your answer to an essay question is abstract, support it with a concrete example that illustrates your point. The sponsor wants to see evidence that you satisfy their criteria, not just unsupported statements.

2. APPLY ONLY IF YOU ARE ELIGIBLE

Read all eligibility requirements and directions carefully. Your application will not be considered if you aren't qualified to apply.

3, IDENTIFY THE SPONSOR'S GOALS

Try to understand the sponsor's motivation in offering the award. Are they promoting interest in their field? Do they want to identify future researchers and business leaders? Identifying their goals can direct your application toward satisfying those goals, increasing your chances of winning the award.

4. COMPLETE THE APPLICATION IN FULL AND FOLLOW DIRECTIONS

Give yourself a competitive advantage by following directions carefully. Provide everything required, but don't supply things not requested. Complete the entire application. If a question doesn't apply, note that on the application rather than leaving it blank.

5. NEATNESS COUNTS

Make several photocopies of all the application forms to use as working drafts as you develop your application packet. It is always best to type the application. If you must print, do so neatly and legibly. Proofread the entire application carefully. Nothing is less impressive than an application with misspelled words or grammar errors. Ask a friend, teacher or parent to proofread it as well.

6. WRITE AN ACCOMPLISHMENTS RESUME

Compile a list of all your accomplishments. This will help you identify your strengths and prepare a better application. Give a copy of the resume to the people writing letters of recommendation for you. It will help them know you better.

7. WATCH ALL DEADLINES

Impose a deadline for yourself that's at least two weeks before the application deadline. Use this time to proofread your application. You are responsible for making sure the application arrives on time. This includes supporting materials, such as letters of recommendation and transcripts. Give contributors to your application ample lead-time.

8. MAKE SURE YOUR APPLICATION GETS WHERE IT NEEDS TO GO

Before sending, make a copy of the entire application packet for your file. Make sure your name appears on all pages of the application. Pieces of your application may get lost unless the pages are clearly identified.

9. ASK FOR HELP IF YOU NEED IT

If you have problems with the application, call the sponsor. They will be glad to help. But don't expect them to do the work for you. Completing the application is your job.

10. YOUR SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION REPRESENTS YOU

Your ability to submit a neat, timely, complete application reflects on you. It's the face you present to the sponsoring organization. Take pride by submitting the best application you can.
